Furthermore I understand that no extensions are given for study abroad and all work must be turned in before I leave my host university. I also understand that due to the distance, travel time, and cost it is not possible for students to return to the U.S. while studying abroad. The only exception would be for students studying at Copenhagen, who may return to the U.S./home during the October-break **ONLY** (though it is not recommended). (Note that students will be allowed to return home for a long weekend/short week for a very important family event such as a wedding - please alert the study abroad director to such impending situations to seek an exception.)
