2 Don't Forget! (Costs that are frequently forgotten)

- Make sure the costs are <u>current/for the summer</u>.
 - Sometimes posted prices are outdated and not accurate for when you are travelling; contact the intended program to confirm.
- Transportation to/from the airport to program
 - Some programs offer a service, but research and compare with other options to ensure what's best.
- Miscellaneous items you'll need everyday, i.e. laundry, academic books, etc.
- Regarding airfare—navigate the search for each option, stopping before booking confirmation, as if purchasing the tickets to view <u>all taxes</u> calculated with the airfare.
 - Look at airfare that is "travel-wise" (only 1 connection max, bigger name carrier, times are conducive to getting around, etc.), <u>not</u> only the least expensive option.
