History

The DoD NDSEG Fellowship Program is awarded to U.S. citizens, U.S. nationals, and U.S. dual citizens who intend to pursue a Doctoral degree aligned to the DoD services Broad Agency Announcements (BAAs) in research and development at a U.S. institution of their choice.

Since the program's inception, over 4,400 fellowships have been awarded from over 70,000 applications received.

The three-year Fellowship program, will award between 150-350 fellowships annually, and is designed to encourage baccalaureate, masters, and current PhD candidates early in their course of study recipients to enter graduate school and ultimately gain doctorates that align to the DoD services Broad Agency Announcements (BAAs) and other strategy documents in research and development.

Evaluation

NDSEG fellowships will be awarded on a **merit basis**. This merit-based evaluation of applicants will rely on the applicant's application, including academic records, CV, Essays and research proposals.

Each application will be evaluated by a panel of academic experts who have **doctoral degrees from the science and engineering discipline** of the applicant's proposed advanced degree program.

Participating DoD agencies will select **final awardees from the top-ranked applicants**. Final selection of fellows will be made by AFRL, ARO, ONR, and other sponsoring DoD agencies.

Systems Plus will notify successful and unsuccessful applicants within 14 days of the official award.

Fellows must provide their acceptance soon after receiving their award notification. **Notifications will be sent via email**. If an official letter is required by your Institution, notify the DoD NDSEG Program Office at <a href="https://www.nds.notify.not

To be eligible for the NDSEG Fellowship, you must meet 5 basic criteria:

- Be a U.S. Citizen, U.S. Dual Citizen, or U.S. National
- Have completed your undergraduate studies prior to the commencement of the fellowship in September of the fellowship year.
- Be applying to, accepted to, or currently enrolled at an accredited graduate-level institution within the United States. *If enrolled, you must be or near the beginning (within first 2 years) of your Graduate study in Science or Engineering.*
- Have at *least* THREE remaining years in your graduate degree program as of September 2025
 - Be pursuing research in alignment with one or more specific topics identified in the Department of Defense's BAAs

- Mandatory attendance to the DoD National NDSEG Fellows
 Conference within their award term



Additional Information About DoD Strategy Document (BAA)

Applicants must find the DoD Strategy Document that list research areas that relate to your discipline/area of research. The Research Proposal should reflect your field of study as well as connect with one of the DoD Strategy Document's.

In the application, there is a section to list the DoD Strategy Document number (**not the name** of the DoD Strategy Document), and the name of the research area you select. The general rule is that if it's listed under one of the DoD Strategy Documents and it is an open and current DoD Strategy Document, applicants can write their proposal in that area.

List the title of the research area your proposal will support. This is to ensure you are responding to one of the DoD Strategy Documents. Additionally, in the application is a field to incorporate a title for your proposal.

Personal Essay

The personal essay consists of two text fields (500 words max each, no special formatting):

- Answer the following: What are your short and long-term professional goals? How did these goals develop? How have you already begun to lay the foundation for these goals? How does this fellowship fit into these goals?
- Personal story statement to describe the Fellows personal journey to get where they are today (e.g., 1st to receive PHD, 1st to go to college, worked multiple position while achieving degree, what it took personally to get to where they are, etc...)

This submission tab requires you provide the following:

- Redacted and Original versions of your proposal
- List the DoD Strategy Document title that relates to your research proposal.
- List the title of your project (This can be unique to you it does not need to be a title from the BAAs provided.)
- Research Proposal Abstract (Please enter in a Publicly Releasable Abstract of your Research Proposal being submitted with your application)

Additional Application Categories

Resume/CV [Redacted and Original Versions] – Upload a PDF of your most up-to-date Resumes/CV

Up to 3 References [Highly Recommended but not required to submit application] – References should be provided by an Academic Advisor, Research Advisor, or Internship Supervisor. References can complete a reference form via a systems link sent by a Fellow via their online application. Letters on letterhead will NOT be accepted. The Reference Evaluation Forms link includes a space for additional comments. Reference should capture professional assessment of the applicant, a testimony to your scholarly excellence.

If for any reason an application does not contain all of the required elements, it will not be reviewed. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure the completeness of the application.

Application Tips

Have an Advisor review your Proposal, Personal Statement/Application

Log into the system periodically to ensure references have been submitted

Keep in mind the actual proposal is no more than 3 pages, the 4th page is for the cited work only.
