Timeline & Eligibility

- Campus Nomination Deadlines vary by institution
 - Caltech: Initial campus deadline April 23, 2026; final nomination by Oct 30, 2026
- National Application Deadline: Typically, in early November, following campus nominations
- Interviews: Conducted between early November and February
- Final Decisions Announced: Around mid-March 2027

Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be a graduating senior nominated by one of the Watson Foundation's ~40 partner institutions
- **Citizenship**: U.S. citizens or international students are eligible, but must be nominated by a partner college
- **Projects** must be:
 - Conducted entirely outside the U.S.
 - Independent and unfunded by academic institutions
 - Without formal employment, and in regions not restricted by U.S. travel advisories

Getting Started—Step-by-Step

- 1. Check Your Eligibility
 - a. Confirm your school is a Watson partner and confirm your expected graduation date aligns.
- 2. Secure Campus Nomination
 - a. Initiate the process with your campus Watson liaison, complete internal materials and possibly a video intro
- 3. Build Your Application:
 - a. **Personal Statement** (~1,200–1,500 words) explaining your drive and personal connection to the Watson opportunity.
 - b. **Project Proposal** (~1,200–1,500 words) detailing your travel plan, countries visited, and methodology
 - c. **Resume**, unofficial transcripts, travel history, language proficiencies, 100-word bio, and optional personal video (used on some campuses like Bryn Mawr or Bowdoin)
 - d. **Two letters of recommendation**, at least one from faculty

4. Campus Interviews & Nomination

a. Completing your internal application leads to campus interviews and selection of nominees who advance to the national level

5. Finalize National Submission & Interview

- a. Revise your essays for the final submission (early Nov).
- b. Participate in a **one-hour interview** with a Watson Foundation representative

Tips to Build a Competitive Application

Project Design:

- Must flow from a deep personal passion, show independence, courage, adaptability, and have broad global relevance
- Must avoid countries you've lived/studied in, unless only briefly visited (4–6 weeks)
- Avoid regions with advisory levels 3 or 4 (U.S. State Department)

Presentation & Voice:

- The Fellowship values imagination, integrity, emotional maturity, resourcefulness, and leadership
- o Be authentic—this fellowship supports people, not academic credentials.

Recommend Date Strategy:

 Start outreach to recommenders early and vet them for knowledge of your personal narrative and project vision.

Selection Process Overview

- Campus-level selection includes review and interviews by your college's Watson committee
- Watson Foundation Interviews: National nominees participate in rigorous onehour conversations with foundation representatives
- Award Announcement: Final decisions come in mid-March

Benefits & Fellowship Expectations

- Stipend: Approximately \$40,000 for a solo fellow; \$50,000 if accompanied by a spouse or dependent
- Additional Support:
 - o Health insurance.
 - Repayment of federal and institutional loans (Perkins, Stafford) for 12 months
 - Extra stipend for PAS or spouse support.

• Fellowship Requirements:

- Must spend a full 12 months abroad, with no return to the U.S. or your home country
- Attend a pre-departure webinar (spring) and a returning fellows' conference the following August
- o Submit quarterly updates and a final expense report

Summary Checklist

- Confirm your school is a Watson nominating institution
- Meet internal campus deadline (typically Sept–Nov)
- Draft and refine personal statement & project proposal
- Submit necessary documents: resume, transcripts, travel/history, languages, recommenders
- Attend campus interview and secure nomination
- Submit final application to Foundation in early November
- Prepare for and complete the national interview
- Be ready to depart by August 1, 2027, if awarded
- Submit interim reports and attend conferences as required
