






LOCATION

- Located in Palaiseau, France
- Just about a 45 minute train ride to
 Paris, France
 HISTORY
- Founded in 1794 during the French Revolution
- Originally built in the Latin Quarter of Central Paris,
 moved to Palaiseau in 1976
- In 1805 Napoléon Bonaparte transformed the school into a military institution (still honors military beginnings today)
- Currently have 2,800 students and 680 Faculity memebers



WHAT ARE THE GRANDES ECOLES?

The grandes écoles are the top tier of French Universities (literally in French "higher schools"). These are Frances higher education establishments outside the main framework of the French university system. The grandes écoles select students for admission based chiefly on national ranking in competitive written and oral exams. In contrast, French public universities have a legal obligation to accept all candidates of the region who hold a baccalauréat.

Ecole Polytechinique ranked 1st or 2nd

Ecole Polistechnique SCHOLARS PROGRAM

- Minimum 3.3 Cumulative GPA Required
- Must be a current sophomore or junior to apply
- Study abroad during Fall term
- Some classes are taught in French
- Must be able to read, write, and comprehend French at least Intermediately
 - Formal French Assessment given by
 Caltech's French instructor
- 14-week term (Early Sept. to mid December)





- Students take classes only from Year 3 (courses numbered in the 500 range)
- Students take 4 classes in their Programme
 d'Approfondissement (option) + a possible
 humanities class + a required French class
 (students evaluated for best fit class)

CLASSES/ACADEMICS


- Note that Year 3 classes are typically equivalent to senior year or first year graduate student level
- Students should not assume Year 3 classes are equal to junior year classes at Caltech
- If a student would like to go as a junior, they must demonstrate adequate preparation for the higher-level course by the end of sophomore year

ACADEMICS CONTINUED

- Students will meet with professor in charge of specialization to discuss courses and possible changes on first day
- Courses are on block schedule and meet once per week around 4-5 hours
- HSS courses are around 2 hours each week
- Final exams are the last two weeks of the term
- Most science classes earn 5 or 10 ECTS, HSS courses earn 2-4 ECTS, & French class 2 ECTS
- Caltech students are required to earn at least 36 Caltech units= approx. 20 ECTS





CAMPUS LIFE
