
Exchange & Study Abroad

All SAEX Programs

- Two application rounds a year
 - Semester 1 (February June)
 - Semester 2 (July November)
- Study for one or two semesters
- Enroll in three or four classes (called subject in Australian English)
 from any discipline areas
- Undergraduate and graduate programs available
- Live on or off campus




- Students can enroll in these subjects once they have accepted their offer to study at Melbourne


Terminology





Entry Requirements

- Grades: 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- Students need to have completed two semesters of full-time study before commencing at Melbourne
- Some subjects have pre-requisites
- Students need to meet home institution requirements





Study Abroad Program Fees


Study abroad students pay a set tuition fee at the published rate for every semester, which allows them to enroll in three or four subjects.

In addition to tuition fees, Study Abroad students are required to pay for:
